

Elnathan John is a writer, lawyer and one of the most prominent satirists of Nigeria. His writings have been published in numerous collections. He has been nominated for the Caine Prize twice. His debut novel, *Born on a Tuesday*, won the Betty Trask Award and he was a judge for the Man Booker Prize 2019.

With his blunt satire, writer Elnathan John presents a provocative guideline for Nigerians. His book shockingly portrays how power is exerted, negotiated and abused in private and public spaces, in politics, economy and religious institutions. Elnathan John describes manners and cultural practices in Nigeria amusingly and concretely. He holds a mirror up to the Nigerian community and simultaneously invites Nigerians to humorously reflect upon their behaviour.
